Sensitivity Editing

A sensitivity editor is someone who is paid to read, assess, and review unpublished manuscripts for issues of misrepresentation, cultural inaccuracies, unconscious biases, passive and blatant racism, offensive stereotypes and tropes, and/or problematic language.

Sensitivity editors are hired on a freelance-basis for a range of projects, based on their areas of expertise and lived experiences. They make editorial recommendations by highlighting certain aspects of the manuscript that could cause offense if published. The writer is free to take on board or reject these suggestions. A sensitivity reader, like any editor, is never prescriptive.

Sensitivity editors, like any editor, want to ensure that diverse characters (written by an author outside of the community) are nuanced and not stereotyped. As human beings, we are all diverse, dynamic and unique. If there are stereotypes, a sensitivity editor ensures that these are not offensive or hurtful. It is never good to make fun of another person for their culture, language and heritage.

A sensitivity editor also makes sure that visual representations are done sensitively. They look at symbols and signs. They understand that symbols are culturally-specific and not everyone sees and interprets a sign the same way.

Last but not least, a sensitivity editor knows that everyone has different sensibilities when it comes to being represented in books, film and media. They want to make sure that authors are being incidentally inclusive and not tokenistic.
